Why are you seeking your office?

Also, Georgia needs a watchdog that will look out for consumer interests and protect them from companies that are charging them for services they aren't receiving. Georgia needs a bold and innovative advocate to protect consumers' interests.

Pick one issue. Expand on how you will address it.

Every community use tax credits to attract businesses to their communities. If elected, I will create a residential and commercial energy pilot program. Local communities can reduce the tax credits by offering a ten year, zero percent interest loan for businesses to purchase an energy technology. With the cost savings, businesses can expand and create more jobs which will increase tax revenues. Businesses participating in the pilot program will revert the energy to the main grid during high peak demand times. This will lower electricity rates for consumers. We need solutions that can offer the biggest bang for our buck.
