Why are you seeking your office?

While we have made a lot of progress in many areas, Gwinnett still faces challenges inherent with growth and change. We can't stand still or we will be facing the same problems that some of our neighbors are. We are seeing payoff from our redevelopment efforts but we have to keep pushing to revitalize some of the older areas of Gwinnett. What do you expect to accomplish if elected?

The specific issues on which I plan to focus include evaluating transportation options, protecting Gwinnett's water supply, upgrading water and sewer infrastructure, pushing economic revitalization, expanding community engagement, maintaining excellent basic services and ensuring fiscal responsibility.

What distinguishes your candidacy?

Without a doubt, my experience and knowledge of Gwinnett County define the unique qualities that I bring to service as Commission Chairman. I have been involved with local government in Georgia for almost four decades, mostly here in Gwinnett. I have demonstrated over the last five years that I can lead Gwinnett with integrity and work productively with the district commissioners, with the other elected officials in County government and with the leaders of our 16 cities. Gwinnett residents and owners do not have to guess about my ability and my dedication---they have seen it in action.

What are the key issues in your race?

Certainty of water supply is one of the most critical issues for the future of Gwinnett. Economic redevelopment is very important, to generate jobs for residents and resources for schools, cities and the county. There are major projects in water and
