How can we improve school safety?

Pick one issue. Expand on how you will address it.

Not all students need to be prepared to attend a 4-year college and receive an undergraduate degree. Our communities are filled with top-notch trade schools that are under-utilized and labor shortages exist in a multitude of trades.

I propose the Trade Industry Apprenticeship (TIA) program, which allows students who don't intend to enroll at a 4-year institution to apprentice in their chosen craft. These apprenticeships allow for experiential learning as well as tuition money for a technical school through public and private partnerships with tax credits. This is similar to a G.I. Bill for technical and trade workers.
