Why are you seeking your office?

My two daughters inspired me to run. During the 2016 election, they observed that "no one is being kind to each other and you, mom, have to do something to bring us together." They are right. What do you expect to accomplish if elected?

How can we improve school safety?

To do so, I support increased safety measures at all schools such as the hiring of additional security personnel and by providing teachers and counselors the resources they need to identify troubled students. I do not support arming teachers as others have proposed.

Improving our education system is one of my top priorities in the Senate. The QBE, which is the formula used to fund public education, has not been updated since 1985. This is unacceptable. I will work to revise the formula to fully fund our schools. We need to give students a 21st century education so they are equipped to compete in the world economy. Likewise, I will advocate for the legislature to provide the resources teachers need in the classroom to shrink class sizes and to reduce the amount of standardized testing.
