1.Why are you seeking your office?

I started my campaign by getting to know the people I represent, and I will continue with that plan until the end. Events hosted for me have created a platform for me to get to know the residents in my district and hear the issues that are important to them. 4. Pick any one issue. Expand on how you will address it.

One of the biggest issues is the large number of homeless veterans and the lack of affordable housing. Gwinnett County is the home of over 50,000 veterans, with an estimated 10,000 being homeless. The lack of affordable housing has forced a large number of residents, including veterans, to live in motels for an extended period of time. My campaign is seeking to create collaborative efforts between private and interjurisdictional agreements that will bring the costs of development to a more affordable rate within the county.

5. Suggest ways to jump-start the economy after COVID-19.

I suggest the county partner with the local Community Improvement Districts (CIDs) to develop and administer an economic loan program. It would help businesses impacted by the pandemic by offering zero-interest, 5 year term loans, with a forgiveness component to meet ordinary and necessary operating expenses and obligations. The program is designed to bring financial relief to small businesses who have sustained significant economic injury. The funds can be used to cover working capital costs, such as payroll, accounts payable, rent, mortgage and other necessary expenses. The goal is to help them survive during the crisis and resume normal operations.
