1.Why are you seeking your office?

Having plans that take 18 months to develop may have worked before, but now, the parameters for the plan are usually outdated before the plan itself is even finished. In the software world, we adapted to an agile software approach to address this situation, and applying that model to government can allow us to be more nimble and adaptable to the ever changing reality.

5. What are your ideas on curbing all the many area-wide shooting?

I was able to create a police citizens advisory committee to discuss, analyze, and debate difficult issues related to public safety. The county has created a public safety community outreach division, and we have been working on actively engaging our community to make sure we continue to reduce crime in the county and stay a leader in public safety in the state. Building community associations and improving communications and customer service will all be necessary to improve public safety in todays world.

I am the grandson of Chinese immigrants who came to Georgia to engineer the original MARTA heavy rail network. I am a 3rd generation engineer, graduating from Georgia Tech with highest honors having developed some of the first websites on the internet, the first apps on the iPhone, and the first apps in the App Store.
