5. What are your ideas on curbing all the many area-wide shooting?

Bring back the concealed weapon permit that was eliminated last session. Pass a red flag law to identify troubled citizens who are mentally unfit to own/carry a firearm. Raise the age to purchase or own an assault weapon from 18 to 21.
